Greetings Parents and Guardians,

As you know, staff and students at Holland are extra busy this Spring semester, whether it be extracurriculars, DYAD, tutoring, UIL competitions or academic learning in the classroom. In addition to all things fun, Spring also brings about testing season.

With the Spring Semester arrival, the STAAR testing season is also fast approaching! These assessments are required by the Texas Education Agency and are used to evaluate school district performance as well as individual student performance. These assessments measure how well students have mastered the content and skills identified in the TEA standards. In preparation, we would like to inform you of the testing dates & schedule.

The most important thing that you can do for your child during testing is make sure that he/she comes to school on the days they have tests. Making up a missed test means time out of class and losing important learning time that cannot be made up. In addition to attendance, your child will do his/her best on the tests if they:

- \circ $\ \ \,$ Take the tests seriously and give his or her best effort,
- o Get to bed early the night before to be well-rested on the day of the test,
- Have a good breakfast on the morning of the test,
- Come to school on time.

Reminders for testing dates:

- Please make sure students are present and punctual on testing dates to ensure they get the full time allotted and do not feel rushed.
- We also encourage students to avoid bringing backpacks, cell phones, smart watches, and all other nontest related items to school on testing dates.
- During these testing dates, students must still follow the Houston ISD dress code guidelines which requires their uniform and a sweatshirt (if desired).
- Students MUST either bring lunch from home or get it in the cafeteria. Parent food drop offs ARE NOT allowed during state testing.

All cell phones and smart watches will be taken up before testing begins.

Any cell phone that is not placed away in the space mandated by the teacher and found during testing will result in the cell phone being taken to the front office and held until the student's parent pays the school allotted amount. <u>The fee for phones taken up during testing is \$30.</u>
