Principal's Letter: Walking with the Pack

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Recently, you may have heard about a student movement, National School Walkout, which will take place this Friday, April 20th, to recognize the 20th anniversary of the Columbine High School tragedy. In the aftermath of the most recent tragedy in Parkland, Florida, Westside student leaders reached out to me to express ideas for supporting their peers at Douglas High School. These students have worked to initiate a thoughtful and reasonable method to participate in the national walk-out, while at the same time demonstrating their support for Parkland, in a safe, respectful, non-disruptive manner that is inclusive of many student perspectives. They have designed a "Westside Way" to participate in the national student movement right here on the Westside campus-- ***Walking with the Pack***. By design, the stated purpose of the

student-led walk is to:

- Demonstrate support for the victims and survivors of Parkland, Florida
- Advocate for safe schools

Westside students have the option of "Walking with the Pack" this Friday, April 20th during Guidance Period at 10:00 AM, thus minimizing loss of instructional time. Students who wish to participate will walk as a unified group around the perimeter of our campus and return to their classrooms. Alternatively, students may choose to remain in Guidance class. Accommodations for students with physical disabilities will be established if requested. The goal is to respect the spectrum of different perspectives with safe options for expression of free speech. The school day will continue as scheduled and attendance will be taken at

the beginning and end of the Guidance period. We do want to make you aware that media may be present and film activities from a distance off-campus.

Students are expected to express their views in a peaceful manner. Students who engage in disruptive speech/expression that impedes school operations, or impinges on the rights of other students, will face disciplinary consequences according to the Student Code of Conduct and may not be allowed to participate. Students who wish to attend the protest at City Hall will require parent permission to leave campus. HISD's policy is for its **employees** to remain viewpoint-neutral, meaning that our individual and collective role of the staff is to allow students' freedom of expression, while en-

suring the safe and orderly operation of school (supervision). Because safety will be our top priority, parents and visitors may not participate in the walk.

This school year will go down in the books as one of the most interesting! I could not be prouder of the resiliency and courage among our student body. The Vaping Craze: Students are struggling with nicotine addiction in ways they could not predict due to the potency of e-liquid. E-cigarette and vaporizer companies report that inhaling e-liquid is “safer” than tobacco. This is how they are getting away with it. Tobacco products contain 5000-3500 harmful, toxic chemicals compared to e-liquid’s 25-50 harmful, toxic chemicals. What they are not telling the public is that e-liquid is composed primarily of propylene glycol, the base ingredient of antifreeze. When propylene glycol or its derivatives are heated, toxic chemicals and metals are emitted. These have been shown to cause cancer, lung disease, bronchial infections, and chronic pulmonary disease.






