English



- ⇒ Pre-AP English I: Students will continue the analysis and synthesis of chapters two and three in Animal Farm.
 Students will also be taking a common assessment
 covering reading comprehension TEKS/objectives.
- ⇒ Pre-AP English II: Students will be working on essay skills and reading about surveillance dystopias.
- ⇒ **English III (Morton):** Students are continuing the novel *Grapes of Wrath*, focusing upon the importance of dialect and cultural divisions.
- ⇒ English IV (Morton): Students will focus upon character traits and archetypes in British literature.
- ⇒ AP/Dual Credit Language and Composition: Students will practice writing synthesis essays over a variety of sources.
- ⇒ AP/Dual Credit British Literature: Students will practice literary analysis writing and will continue their unit on sonnets.
- ⇒ Business English: Students will revise their college admissions essays and take a quiz over Second Hundred SAT Vocabulary words 1 -20. Students will also prepare for the Critical Reading section of the SAT.

- ⇒ **Algebra II (Polley):** Students will find the focus and directrix of a parabola.
- ⇒ **Geometry (Polley):** Students will prove triangles congruent by ASA and AAS.
- ⇒ **Pre-Calculus (Kim):** Students will find the exact values of the trigonometric functions using the unit circle.
- ⇒ AP Calculus: Students will use the Fundamental Theorem of Calculus to represent a particular antiderivative and the analytical and graphical analysis of functions.
- ⇒ AP Statistics: Students will use the sampling distribution of sample means to solve problems.
- ⇒ College Algebra: Students will solve quadratic equations by using the Zero Product Property, the Square Root Property, and the Quadratic Formula.


