

English



- ⇒ **Pre-AP English I:** Students will begin working on their gun policy research papers.
- ⇒ **Pre-AP English II:** Students will be teaching and learning about a wide variety of student-directed issues.
- ⇒ **English III (Morton):** Students are completing research related to current prison reform issues and continuing to read *A Lesson Before Dying*.

- ⇒ **English IV (Morton):** Students have completed researching current ethical issues in science and are writing their rough draft for their final research paper. Students are also continuing to read *Frankenstein*.
- ⇒ **AP/Dual Credit Language and Composition:** Students will read and analyze selections from Thoreau's *Walden* and prepare for their upcoming HCC final as well as the AP exam.
- ⇒ **AP/Dual Credit British Literature:** Students will break down the structure of several types of sonnets to explore the ways a poem's structure contribute to its meaning. Students will prepare for their upcoming HCC final as well as the AP exam.
- ⇒ **Business English:** Students will begin brainstorming and drafting their professional resumes.


Math



- ⇒ **Algebra I:** Students are teaching review material and practice problems to their classmates in preparation for their upcoming STAAR exam.
- ⇒ **Algebra II (Baker):** Students are each teaching a 20 minute topic and are responsible for notes and practice problems.

- ⇒ **Algebra II (Polley):** Students will solve natural logarithmic equations.
- ⇒ **Geometry:** Students will use tangent lines to solve problems.
- ⇒ **Pre-Calculus (Baker):** Students are each teaching a 20 minute topic and are responsible for notes and practice problems.
- ⇒ **Pre-Calculus (Kim):** Students will find the limit of the polynomials.
- ⇒ **AP Calculus:** Students will calculate, interpret, and apply integrals.
- ⇒ **AP Statistics:** Students will continue with their personalized AP test review strategies.
- ⇒ **College Algebra:** Students will solve systems of equations using matrices.

Science



- ⇒ **Pre-AP Chemistry:** Students will review ionic equations and redox reactions.
- ⇒ **AP Biology:** Students will learn about nervous and locomotor systems.

- ⇒ **AP Physics:** Students will review topics studied throughout the course.

Social Studies



- ⇒ **AP Human Geography:** Students will evaluate problems and solutions associated with growth and decline within urban areas.
- ⇒ **US History (Morton):** Students are reading and responding to historical era written works and primary sources.

- ⇒ **Government and Economics (Morton):** In government, students are continuing to read case studies and relating them to civil liberties. In economics, students are continuing to study math in economics.

Fine Arts, CTE, LOTE, PE



- ⇒ **Model United Nations:** Students will continue their NGO final exam project.
- ⇒ **Theater Arts I:** Students will be working on scripting their final production.
- ⇒ **Practicum-in-Business:** Students will learn how to write cover letters for a job, college, or scholarship interview.

- ⇒ **BIMS Dual Credit:** Students will review for their HCC Final Exam, scheduled for May 7 (A Day) and May 8 (B Day).
- ⇒ **PE:** Students will learn the rules of and basic techniques for kickball before playing the game.
