TRIO Education develops curriculum and training for the construction industry to solve the skilled labor shortage


- TRIO formed the first industry-led partnership in 2017 with an ISD and Community College to offer high school students electrical training
- Program has grown to 14 different locations across Texas with a projected enrollment of over 700 students

TRIO's curriculum teaches students how to become safe and productive electricians

- Lessons are taught using a video-based program with performance verification delivered via a Learning Management System (LMS)
- Hands-on lab simulations are also conducted using Virtual Reality (VR) headsets
- · Coursework includes the NEC, OSHA, electrical safety, device fabrication and installation, conduit bending and installation, and wire pulling

How Does It Work:

This program teaches students essential skills necessary to enter the electrical trade.



We do this by:

- Teaching the basic concepts needed to get a job
- Demonstrating hands-on skills
- Practicing learned skills using VR equipment
- Individualized coaching based on results
