Booker T. Washington High School




Overview

- ✓ Natural light will be provided through the exterior windows at the learning centers and clerestories at many of the extended learning areas.
- ✓ New auditorium.
- ✓ The learning commons is dispersed throughout the building allowing for flexible learning environments within the neighborhoods and in the building's main atrium.
- Engineering and science laboratories have high bay interior space and direct access to exterior learning courtyards.
