 - e. Portfolios/Performances
 - 2. Daily Grades:
 - a. Homework
 - b. Class work/ Practice
 - 3. Minor Grades:
 - a. Scavenger hunts
 - b. Labs
 - c. Quizzes
 - d. Socratic Seminar

- e. Online discussion boards
- f. Minor presentations
- ii. As the conversations about grades continued, the following grade distributions were agreed upon to propose to the faculty:
 - 1. 50% majors, 40% minors (quizzes), 10% homework
 - 2. 60% majors, 30% minors, 10% homework
 - 3. 70% majors, 20% minors, 10% homework
- iii. All SDMC members agreed to facilitate the conversation about grades at the next department meetings
- iv. Jay Phillips agreed to create an Excel spreadsheet to see how averages would change based on the proposed grade distributions.

3. Using OnTrack for Major Assessments (4:40-4:50pm)

- a. OnTrack is a district tool that is used to measure student progress each grading cycle. Westside teachers will be required to use the tool for two assessments each cycle beginning cycle 4.
