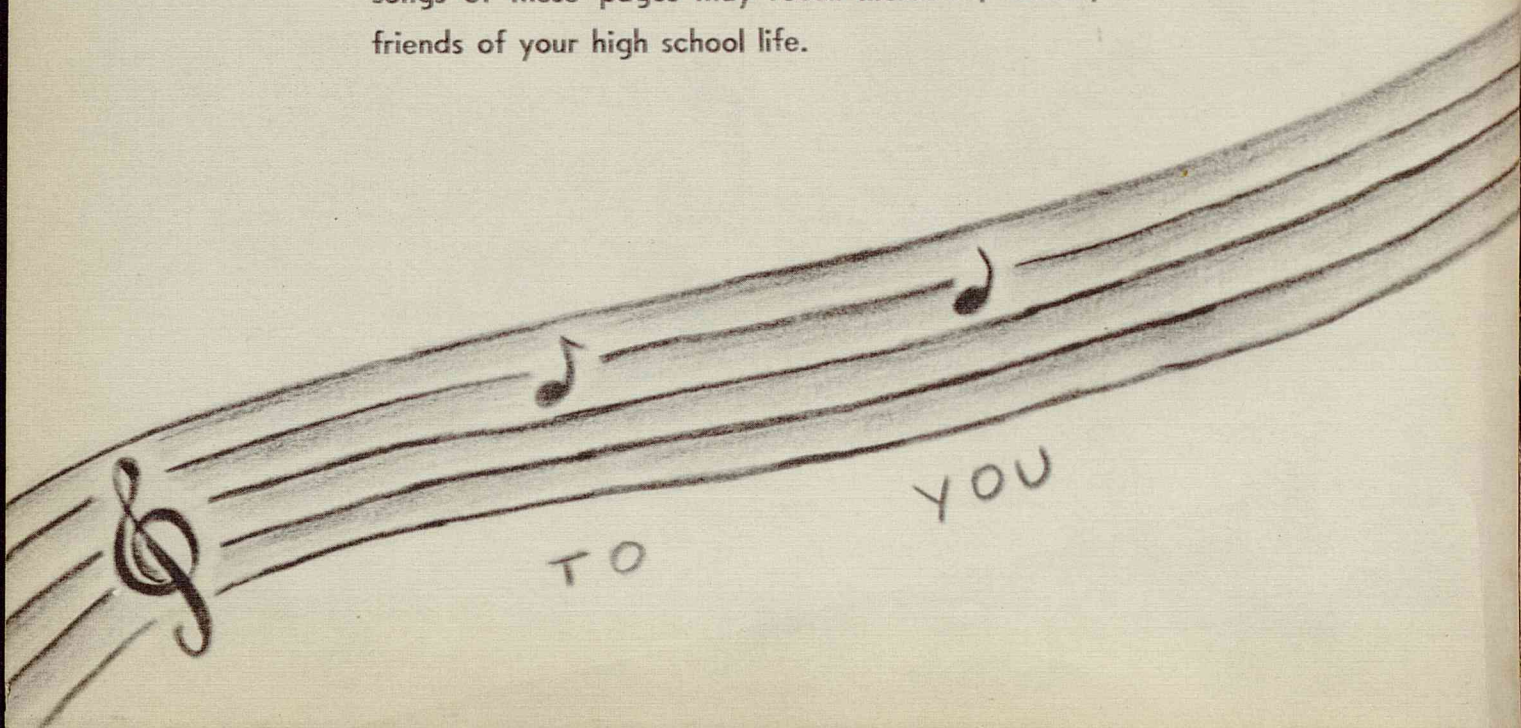


Foreword
