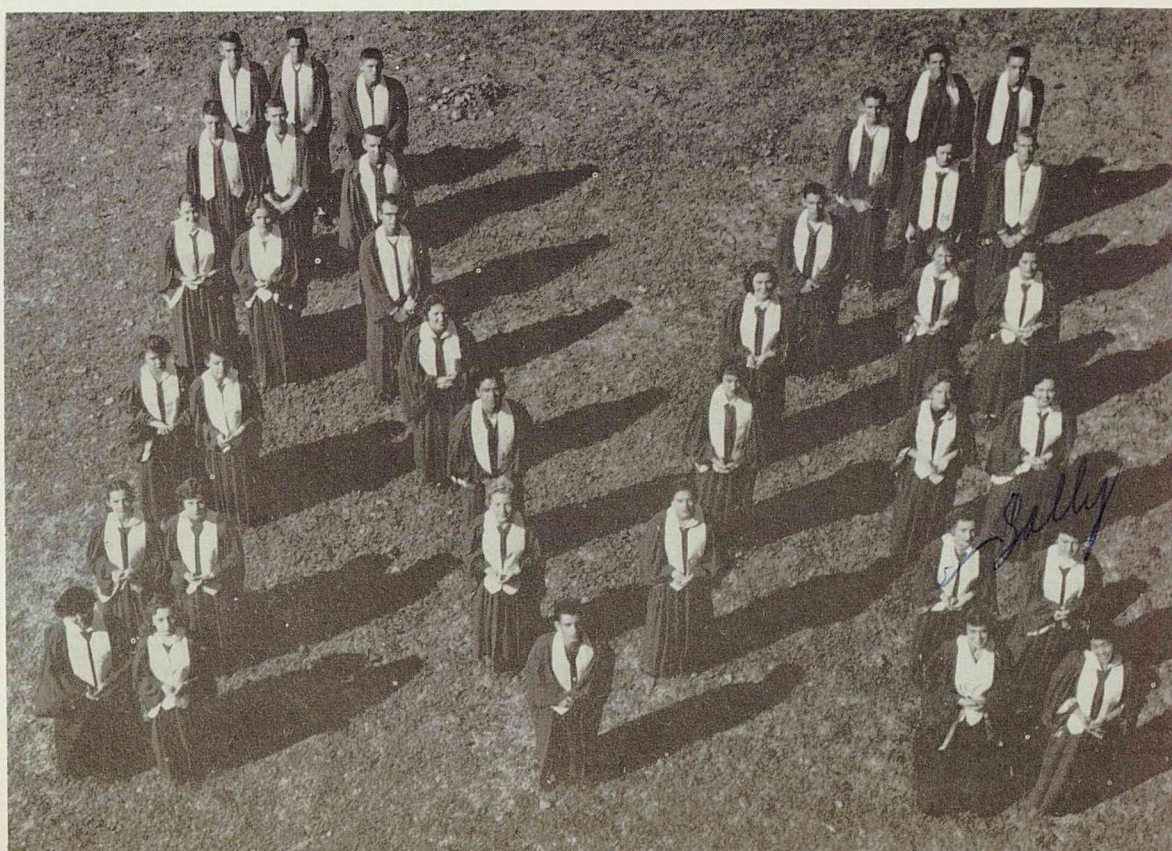
MIXED CHORUS
