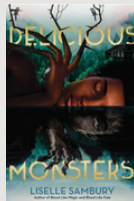


I Rise by Marie Arnold

Happily Ever Afters by Elise Bryant

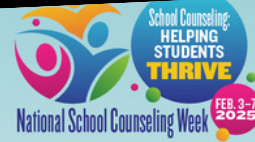
