Course: ESOL IIA / English IIA Overview

Course Descriptions:

English II incorporates the study of literature, writing, vocabulary, and grammar to strengthen student reading, writing, and higher level thinking skills. Students will read and discuss a variety of literary works from the following genres: short story, non-fiction, drama, novel, and poetry. Students will plan, organize, create, and edit a wide variety of writing assignments including essays, open-ended response questions, daily assignments, major projects, and a research paper.

Course Objectives:

1. To read, understand, and evaluate a variety of text

2. To develop writing skills by composing in a wide variety of forms, journal entries, and analysis of literature, personal narratives, persuasive essays and research papers.

3. To learn how to use and evaluate research tools effectively by producing a substantial research project that involves multiple sources of information

- 5. To possess the skills necessary for success in English course work.
