As you know, HISD is addressing classroom overcrowding issues across the district by proposing to redraw attendance zone boundaries at a number of HISD elementary schools.

Thank you so much for your input at the recent community meetings, as well as your emails and telephone calls. After taking into consideration your feedback, HISD administrators have modified the proposed attendance boundaries (see maps also posted on website) in regard to Bush, Daily, Ashford, Askew, and Shadowbriar elementary schools. The district is recommending that Shadowbriar become a PreK-5 stand-alone, boundary-option magnet school without an attendance boundary. Shadowbriar will also serve as the overflow school should Bush, Daily, Ashford, and/or Askew become full.


The proposed boundaries mean that students currently attending Bush, Daily, Ashford, Askew, and Shadowbriar, as well as incoming kindergarten students for the 2015–2016 academic year, may choose to stay at their current school until they go on to middle school. New students enrolling **for the first time next year**, with the exception of kindergarten students, will be required to comply with the attendance boundaries in effect at the time they enroll.

We would like to thank everyone for voicing their comments and concerns. HISD is committed to partnering with parents to develop a plan that benefits all students, and we appreciate your feedback.


