We need to look for better alternatives than our hallways because all of our halls have some form of glass. Alternative locations would be the stage in the gym, bookrooms, main office, and restrooms as a last resort.   |  |  |  |  |
|                                    | Lock down all students are to be quite and away from the doors with lights off. As if the room is empty.  In both cases an announcement will be make for either occurrence.  |  |  |  |  |
|                                    | Make sure students receive a blue Garcia pass when exiting the class and returning in a timely manner with the pass. Make sure the person they went to see signed and time the students' departure. The passes are a tracking system of our students.  |  |  |  |  |
|                                    | Student conversation is one of our greatest signals for controversy among peers. Listen while students are talking. Believe students when they report something. Keep your eyes out for items that students may use as a weapon such as pencils, paper clips, and thumbtacks. Be mindful of that toys are not allowed in school. A student might bring a play gun or knife to school, the other person does not know it's a toy, and it could lead to other problems.
