Students

- Will read daily for 30 minutes and keep up with reading counts points
- Will respect and follow school rules and class rules at all times.
- Will keep up with homework and classwork daily
- Will come to school on time by 7:30 AM ready to learn
- Will bring supplies needed for class daily.

Teachers

- Will prepare and deliver effective instruction daily to ensure students are receiving a quality education.
- Will come to work on time daily.
- Will share with parents and students a reading log and tips/resources based on student reading level.
- Will host two family nights to preview math and reading lessons and share strategies with parents
- Will send student homework and conduct on a daily basis.

Park Place Goals and Focus Areas

Park Place's goal for 2024 – 2025 school year is to maintain the six maximum allowable distinctions on the TEA Accountability Report. We will focus on four goals for this school year:

- Reading Goal: By June 2025, 50% of students in grades 3-5 will score at least a 6 or higher on Extended Constructive Response (ECR) using the RLA Constructed Responses Scoring Guide. By January 2025, 40% of students in grades 3-5 will score at least a 6 or higher on ECR using the RLA Constructed Responses Scoring Guide.
- Math Goal: By May 2025, 100% of students will complete at least 80 lessons on Zearn for grades 3-5 and at least 40 lessons on Zearn for grades K-2. By December 2024, 100% of students will complete 40 lessons on Zearn for grades 3-5 and at least 20 lessons on Zearn for grades K-2.
- Writing Goal: By the end of 2024 2025 school year, the percentage of students taking STAAR Writing who approaches grade level standards will increase by 2% (from 87% to 89%). The percentage of students who meets grade level standards will increase by 2% (from 74% to 76%). The percentage of students who masters grade level standards will increase by 2% (from 30% to 32%).
- Science Goal: By the end of 2024 2025 school year, the percentage of students taking STAAR Science who approaches grade level standards will increase by 5% (from 85% to 90%). The percentage of students who meets grade level standards will increase by 1% (from 49% to 50%). The percentage of students who masters grade level standards will increase by 2% (from 18% to 20%).

Parents

- Will check your child/children's homework and conduct every day.
- Will provide opportunities for your child/children to read at least 30 minutes a day at home.
- Will make sure your child/children come to school in dress code.
- Will make arrangements to have your child dropped off/and pick up on time.
- Will collaborate and participate with the school in all events.
- Will keep the school/teacher informed when there is a concern that may impact the child's academic performance.
