District Goals

The Board of Education's mission is to equitably educate the whole child so that every student graduates with the tools to reach their full potential.

The percentage of 3rd grade students performing at or above grade level in reading as measured by the Meets Grade Level Standard on STAAR will increase 8 percentage points from 42% in Spring 2024 to 50% in Spring 2025.
