• Present electronic ticket, on a mobile device. • DO NOT PRESS "REDEEM", PRIOR TO ENTRY.

AUTHORIZED STAFF WILL COMPLETE THE PROCESS. • When presenting access tickets at the gates, click "VIEW TICKETS".

NOTE: Someone from Lamar administration will be at the entry gate to assist with ticket/entry issues.

Once you have been cleared to check out, you will receive an email notification with a link to select a day and time that works for you come to campus to check out. You must come to the designated location above within your allotted time. You will not be allowed to check out early.

Senior Checkout sheets will be distributed in the transit center. Seniors must take care of any remaining fines and fees before check-out. No senior will be allowed to participate in commencement without going through the check-out process.

Sunday, June 13th GRADUATION DAY

8:00 AM in DELMAR FIELD Seniors will report at 6:30 AM

Graduation is an optional activity. If you choose to participate, proper attire <u>must</u> be worn. Proper attire is:

- The mortarboard (cap) should sit FLAT on the head, not tilted at an angle. All hairstyles should allow the mortarboard to sit correctly on the head. A decorated mortarboard (cap) is allowed; however, it must be PG or it will be confiscated upon entry.
- Gentlemen must wear a collared shirt, with a tie, dark slacks and dress shoes. Dark shoes are best.

- 3. Young ladies should wear dresses, skirts, or dress slacks. Flat shoes or wedges are recommended as graduates will be walking on the artificial turf. They can be a hazard on the ramps as ladies walk across the stage. Also, there is a lot of walking so comfortable shoes are preferred.
- Jeans, shorts, flip-flops, and tennis shoes of any kind are not acceptable. If you wear these items, you will not be permitted to participate in graduation exercises.
- 5. No electronics of any kind will be permitted in the stage area. Seniors will be screened for them before entry.

Family and friends will be admitted for seating at 7:00 AM in Delmar Stadium. Early arrival is advised to ensure best seating. No one may block off seats for guests arriving later. Handicap seating is available; please check with a representative upon entering for assistance. Metal detectors will be used for everyone's safety.

No balloons, banners, air horns or items that distract from the ceremony will be allowed. Security will confiscate these items. This is a solemn and dignified event, and we ask that all families be respectful and attentive as each student graduates. All graduates must leave cameras, purses, cell phones and other personal items outside or with family members. Graduates may bring only their cap and gown into the stadium with them. Caps and gowns must be carried through the security checkpoint and may not be worn as they enter the facility. All Graduates must stay for the entire ceremony.



Testing Updates-

STAAR EOC Exams

STAAR EOC (End of Course) exams will be administered at Lamar HS on June 22 – 24 for all students who were absent from the April/May 2021 administration or who need to retest. Students taking the corresponding courses are expected to take and pass all STAAR EOC exams as part of their graduation requirements. The June STAAR EOC administration is an additional opportunity for students to meet this graduation requirement. STAAR EOC exams can only be taken in-person on campus. Testing will begin at 8:30 AM each day. Students arriving late will not be able to test. Students will be released to go home as they complete testing.

These competencies are:

- Recognizing and accepting feelings.
- Expressing feelings appropriately.
- Building a positive outlook.
- Developing coping skills.
- · Dealing with negative feelings.
- · Dealing with stressful life events.

Littles in our program:

- Are more confident
- Are more likely to stay away from drugs and alcohol
- Do better in school
- Get along better with family and friends
- Feel better about themselves.

To be involved. Littles should:

- Be capable of benefitting from a relationship with a Big
- Attend school regularly
- Want a Big and understand the role of a Big
- Plan on attending the participating school for at least one full year
- Have a parent/guardian willing to be a partner with us by maintaining contact and helping keep us informed of changes within the family/match
- Have access to internet and Zoom for virtual meetings
