THE FUTURE IS HERE

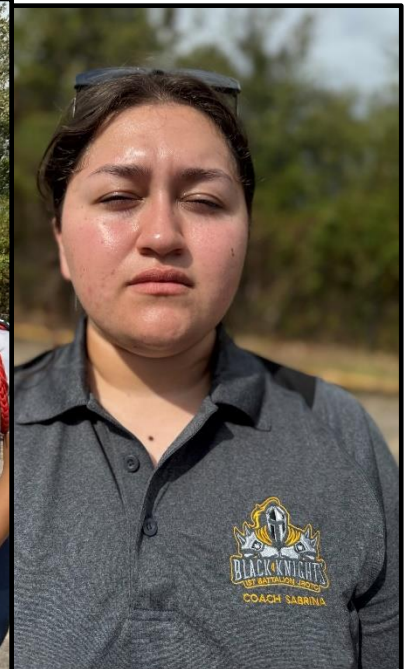
