According to the most recent HISD Growth Report, Helms Elementary School ranks 13th out of 170 elementary schools in Reading/Language Arts student performance growth as measured by STAAR and Stanford/Aprenda. This places Helms in the top quartile for growth among all HISD elementary schools. Congratulations to our students, teachers, staff, and parents!
