Welcome

3:56pm: Approval of previous minutes

3:57pm: Review of TES

Bryan Berry trained teachers during PD Day. \$6000 cap on high achieving teacher's salary increase. Principals have asked for clarification. Teachers' salaries will not go below their current salary. NES teachers get a stipend.

4:01pm: Building Modifications

Fencing conversations included painting the fence, the location of the fence, and having only fence along the entrances to the performance hall and not along the entire side. Carter declined the upgrade for this year. More information will be sent out in the future. The door handles can be removed from the outside of the front door. The committee discusses the pros and cons of having fencing.

Playground- extension for kindergarten playground is underway. Plans are set and contractors have visited.

Spark Park for the cover over the basketball court. Identifying who's responsible for the basketball court is happening now.

Fixing the electrical in the PLC rooms and outlets in the upstairs of the library.

4:21pm: Budget

Budgets were decreased across the budget. Teachers' salaries have increased. Average salaries are adjusted due to NES schools. Budget has increased to \$75/student, but with the salary increases our budget is at approximately \$4.7 million.

Encore will look different everyday based on student needs. Discussion about Encore as project based learning opportunity. Pull out schedule will be planned next week.

We are looking at ELA and final decision will be made after STAAR scores are released. HMH curriculum is not as easy to follow for some teachers. Blue Bonnet curriculum has Spanish supports. Is this the curriculum that has religious stories? The decision will be either HISD curriculum or HMH based on scores and finalized ELAR staff for next year and capacity


5:06 Action Plan
