The Houston Independent School District (HISD) Board of Education established and approved the campus-level planning and decision making process in 1992. This process includes the creation and maintenance of a Shared Decision Making Committee (SDMC) at each school to review the district's educational goals, objectives, and major district wide classroom instructional programs. The SDMC must be *involved in decisions related to* areas specified by the Texas Education Code. The code states that the SDMC will be involved in decisions in the areas of *planning, budgeting, curriculum, staffing patterns, staff development, and school organization.*

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Planning

- Master schedule need more electives. What classes do they like? Increase the variety
- Ideas: creative writing, home economics or culinary, wood shop, cosmetology, photography, computer class/broadcasting, music class with rotation to expose them to different types of music or programming, web design, psychology, financial literacy, college course and helping students write essays and get admitted to college (semester or 1 year class), seminar class for seniors that gives opportunity to experience college style class, welding, HVAC
- Electives: need more art classes. Art should be restructured for students to find success
- Do a needs assessment with teachers to find hidden talents to explore options for electives
- Student interest should be gauged to determine electives offered

Budget

Curriculum

- Tutorials: how do we get them to come?
- Gray from Sharpstown will not be helping at WHS in February due to tutorials at his school. Saturday tutorials was not effective at WHS last year.
- Can we get PTO to find donations? Cost comes from businesses. TVs or playstations or laptops.
- Tutorials during class time—pulling out with teachers or tutors
- Idea to use students to tutor kids during the day for service hours
- Saturday or after school detention pull those kids and tutor them
- SRC kids can they get tutored?
- Are the parents aware that their kid needs tutorials and when they are
- Last year we had some other teachers help support testing by teaching another subject or reinforcing skills

School Organization
