Barring any major expenditures, CVHS is expected to be in good standing with the projected 2022-2023 school year **budget** under the Per Unit Allocation (PUA) model. Typically, 75% of general school funds address salaries. very little turnover of faculty and staff, salaries for CVHS employees comprise approx. 83% of our budget. Outside of salaries, CVHS will have more than \$500,000 in general funds to expend for supplies, materials, In anticipation of next year, the following items provide examples of general expenditures as of 05/10/22 which total close to that amount:
