CVHS SDMC Meeting Minutes

Topics Covered:

The meeting commenced at 8:00 AM.

The SDMC reviewed **waivers** for:

- The Pass / Fail Option allows students to participate in specific elective courses and not have grade point averages negatively impacted. 4point courses hurt students who have a GPA higher than 4.0.
 - The custom **9 week** grading cycle waiver provides more time within a grading cycle for mastery of content before a grade is on a report card.

On 05/07/21, 27 faculty members voted unanimously in favor of both waivers. SDMC had no questions – sounds good, in favor.

With what may be a regular 21-22 school year, there is a request to revisit school safety issues, especially in light of recent mass shootings. Prior to the pandemic, we hired a consultant to assess campus safety including exits and entrances, and help develop a plan. Mr. Moss will revisit the possibility of a presentation by Ms. Ford's homeland security contact during August's inservice training.

Safety and health concerns regarding covid and class sizes were discussed. In general, members want the same safety protocols & resources, contact tracing, ventilations, mask-wearing, etc. especially in light of projected class sizes. According to the draft 21-22 schedule, most teachers will have 30-35 students per class. As persons have more opportunity to receive vaccinations, we will continue following safety guidelines for the projected # of persons on campus.

In May, we celebrate **Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month**.

We celebrate the achievements of Asian American and Pacific Islanders.

We honor the legacy of those who have contributed to a better society whether through activism or entertainment. Students who choose to attend **virtual academies** for 21-22 will lose their spaces at CVHS, but we hope most students return. HISD trustees vote this Thursday.

Dept. chairpersons received a draft 21-22 **master schedule**. Some classes (ie: AP Calculus BC and Pre-AP Comp Sci) • have huge numbers. We want to maintain 3-feet spacing in classrooms. Questions included possibilities of a portable • building & more teachers to reduce the 33:01 student - teacher ratio.

An additional HISD counselor will replace CIS and also have assigned tasks in 504, SEL, CTC.

Mrs. Harris mentioned ELA department con-

cerns regarding **class numbers** in pre-AP / AP writing -intensive courses. Mr. Moss doesn't anticipate changes due to funding.

Mrs. Vadapalli asked:

- Are students able to host camps at CVHS this summer? TBD but we are planning an in-person Fish Camp with a virtual alternative.
- Will CVHS host a virtual College & Career Fair this year? The in-person version was a really big hit for students. It is in development for the fall.
- Will **tennis** practice/ meets resume this school year or summer? In the past, where have students organized/played **basketball**? Try-outs and practices for tennis will occur outdoors when school resumes in August. Indoor practice for club sports such as basketball have been restricted.

Mrs. Schmidt inquired about the **average number of students** in English 1 and AP Human Geography. Can we prioritize smaller numbers in core classes, larger numbers in elective classes? The master schedule was drafted strictly from course requests.
