2.	<p>Grade Level Updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- 4th is having successes with achievement- Adapting to positive changes - growing faster than the first semester- Head start is pushing writing with tier 2 and 3- Field trip for Pre K coming up (outdoor theater)- Head start is sharing progress with parent so they understand how students are progressing (conferences starting soon)- 2nd grade parent sees growth in her student and notices that they enjoy school more and appreciate the accommodation they are receiving- Parents see more consistency with new curriculum- Medicaid is leaving and people need to register before March 31 or they lose coverage. We are helping parents register on Wednesdays- Wraparound parent conference about resources available to parents, students, and families (in person and virtual) March 8th- Nutrition classes for parents and students- Homelessness is an issue school wide - we are trying to provide food, quarters, and transportation
3.	<p>School Updates: Budget, Attendance, Enrollment, Registration, Facilities & Maintenance</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Attendance is better but still an issue (calling parents and submitting SAFS is a way to improve in this area)- Enrollment is low, and we need to enroll more<ul style="list-style-type: none">- We will reach out to students at other schools to try to help improve our enrollment- Small school subsidy - helps closing the gap









That money was spent on technology and hourly pay to support student achievement - We may start losing money for attendance because the Covid hold is being lifted <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Attendance awards suggested by community leaders include treats, dinners, prizes, outings - Incentivizing parents is the key - Working on pre-K enrollment - Some of the general fund was spent on murals and privacy screens - Working on school safety and screening different areas of the school especially the cafeteria (\$10,000 blinds) - Working on sound proofing canvases in the cafeteria painted by local high schoolers - Sidewalk and driveway needs to be redone
