NES overview for SDMC Review information	<p><u>NES Family Overview</u></p> <p><u>NES Community Overview</u></p> <p>Mr. Reyna- Began by going over the NES family overview PowerPoint that was presented to the staff previously.</p> <p>LSSAE is an additional model that would be implemented into the classroom to be able to close the gaps that we see with our students who are behind in the material. Students exit the class in small groups. We would just have to find the space on the school.</p> <p>90-minute lessons will stay in place, but the structure is a bit different (refer to PowerPoint to see the full breakdown).</p> <p>Reviewed the AHS 2-year Data Comparison Fall EOC Results.</p> <p>Art of Thinking course: Teaching students how to learn and how to think. Develop problem solving skills and questioning skills. Learn how to collaborate with peers. Engaging in meaningful conversations. Gain Empathy. The course would take place from 3rd grade through 10th grade so the students would have taken it before they got to our school.</p>

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	<p>There is a certain criteria for the person that is going to teach the course. A secondary certification may qualify the teacher of record. It could also possibly be someone who fits the criteria.</p> <p>Khan: Will there be a change of credits to our students?</p> <p>Reyna: There will still be a 26 credit plan, but this class can be beneficial for our students that are graduating with a 22 credit plan.</p> <p>Charity: Why do we see these courses from 3rd to 10th grade.</p> <p>Reyna: Those grade levels is where students primarily take the STAAR.</p> <p>The master schedule being proposed was run back in 2021 at Austin High School where English and Math is being double blocked.</p> <p>Furr High School already has the master schedule so if we are interested to see how that looks we can look at their schedule.</p> <p>Khan: She has heard about teacher staying longer hours, what are the expectations behind that.</p> <p>Reyna: Improving our planning and professional development. Everyone is expected to open the campus at 6:30 am. Two times a month during the morning. At-bat sessions are scheduled on Thursdays (Demo days).</p> <p>In the model, the campus opens early -Duty time: (6:25 am to 7:45 am) and stays late (from 4:30 pm until 5:30 pm) -Instructional time is the same. As of now, the high schools start their day at 7:45 am to 4:15 pm.</p> <p>Lunches will be minimized to 30 minutes. Students will have their cell phones during lunch, but the expectation during class and during transition is that the students do not have their cell phones out.</p> <p>Credit recovery can be done during the 6:30 pm zero period.</p>
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	<p>Davis: Are we able to rope in parents and make sure that they are accountable?</p> <p>Reyna: We can create a system where once a week, we host parents to make sure that they have all the information necessary that they need for their student.</p> <p>Kerrissey: The 30-minute lunch has been a problem in the past because teachers don't have a conference period.</p> <p>Answer: Every teacher will have a planning period, and it will be 90 minutes with a 30-minute lunch. You will be meeting with your group and doing prep-work.</p> <p>Charity: for 11th grade US History, will I focus on TEKS from the state or HISD</p> <p>Reyna: The NES model will only affect 9th and 10th.</p> <p>Davis: Will there be cameras in the classroom?</p> <p>Answer: Every 9th and 10th-grade, class are set up with a ViewSonic. If the student needs to be removed from the classroom they will be able to see the instruction in the classroom. The cameras do not get turned off so that the students will have access to it. The other reason is also for the teachers to not have to turn it on and off. The teachers also wear mics throughout the day (English 1 English 2 and Algebra 1 and Art of Thinking)</p> <p>Khan: what if someone is sick and needs to be out?</p> <p>Reyna: The Teacher's apprentice would pop into the classroom. There is a ratio for the number of teachers that are in the school.</p> <p>Kerrissey: Will we have the 450 minutes?</p> <p>Monday through Thursday requires 45 minutes of planning time. You actually have more than the 450 minutes.</p>
