Attendees included school administration, faculty representatives, and parent/community stakeholders.

II. Agenda Items

1. School Updates - Presented by Mrs. Lopez Garcia

- **AP Courses:** Sharpstown International will continue offering Advanced Placement courses to maintain academic rigor and promote college readiness.
- IB Programs:
 - o **MYP (Middle Years Program):** Staff retraining is required to ensure alignment with IB standards and teaching practices.
 - o **DP (Diploma Program):** The program continues to deliver strong outcomes, with sustained student success.
- Career & Technical Education (CTE): The school is committed to providing diverse pathways, including trades, to meet students' varied career goals.
- **Early College Program:** A new Early College initiative will launch with the 2025–2026 school year through a partnership with Houston Community College West Loop Campus.

2. Action Plan

- Enhance Staff Instructional Capacity: Continued focus on professional development to improve the quality of teaching across all subject areas.
- College, Career, and Military Readiness (CCMR): As of May 2, the school has achieved a 90% increase in CCMR metrics and is projected to reach 96% by the end of the school year.
- Support for Emergent Bilingual (EB) Students: Targeted coaching and resources are being provided to teachers to better support the school's large EB population.

3. Budget Overview

• General Funds:

Mrs. Lopez Garcia reviewed the use of general funds, which were allocated to the following improvements:

- o Parking lot upgrades
- o Gym renovations
- o New campus signage
- o Furniture purchases for students and teachers
- o Library enhancements

• Title I Funds:

Title I expenditures were used to support student engagement and classroom instruction, including:

- Technology
- o Thinking Maps
- Response cards
- Whiteboards and markers

• Hospitality (now Sunshine Committee):

The Hospitality Club has been renamed the **Sunshine Committee**, which focuses on staff morale and school culture. Funds were used for:

- Treats for staff
- Professional Development Day Treats
- o Game night supplies
- Main dishes for selected potluck events
