General Information

Course Content

Over the school year, students will examine people, places, and environments at local, regional, national, and international scales from the spatial and ecological perspectives of geography. They will describe the influence of geography on past and present events. Additionally, they will focus on how economic, social, political, and environmental processes shape processes such as regional cultural patterns and settlement patterns, and the relationship between the physical environment and climates and ecosystems. Scholars will be expected to use problem-solving and decision-making skills to develop their knowledge and mastery of geography skills.

Expectations and Goals

Learning is an active process that requires active engagement and participation. As a student, you will be expected to practice the behaviors you desire from your friends, family, and neighbors. Occasional and commonplace lapses of judgement are expected and will be met with warnings, conversations, or both. It is expected that students will heed any warnings given. Failure to do so will result in consequences that include office referrals or after school detention. Disrespect, inappropriate and disruptive behavior will not be tolerated.

Assignments and Grading

It is expected that students will complete all assignments with the expectation that it will be graded, as all work given is done with the intent to prepare students for exams.
